- The roof deck has now been removed from all three new skylights and they are all open.
- The new drywall ceilings are proceeding throughout the shopping centre including framing around all three new skylights.
- The framing and installation of tile on the approximately 150 columns throughout the mall continues. Stainless steel corners are being added on the exposed edges to protect the newly clad columns.
- The new doors and carpeting is now complete at mall entrances by Green Earth, CIBC, and Arlies. The balance of the entrances will be scheduled in January and February 2012.
- Until the New Year, the mall doors are now open at 7:00 a.m. to allow our merchants to get into their stores one hour earlier.
- The overhead trellis assembly, including lights and diffusers is mostly complete.
